Scope of Work

Applications are sought from current UCSF Faculty (All Schools) for the position of Yearlong Inquiry Program Director under the Clinical and Translational Science Institute (CTSI). This is an internal UCSF search.

This is a part-time 15% position (at the NIH cap).

The Director will support predoctoral learners as they cultivate the skills necessary to conduct clinical and translational research. General responsibilities include:

- Participating as key personnel on the CTSA grant, including regular engagement with the CTSI leadership and institutional stakeholders in the development, direction, and evaluation of overall CTSI activities.
- Drafting and editing the T32 predoctoral grant renewal (due September 2025) with assistance from the CTSI leadership and staff. The Director will serve as contact PI on the future T32 grant.
- Participating in the annual selection process for new fellows, conducted by the School of Medicine Inquiry Funding Office
- Advising students on coursework and enrollment in the MAS in clinical research
- Facilitating bi-weekly works-in-progress sessions and attending quarterly fellow-run Journal Clubs

- Serving as a resource to fellows who may be experiencing issues with their mentors or issues with their research projects
- Attending the annual Translational Science meeting with fellows (in-person).
- Working closely with the Director of CTSI Workforce Development programs.
- Drafting the annual Progress Report for the NIH/NCATS.
